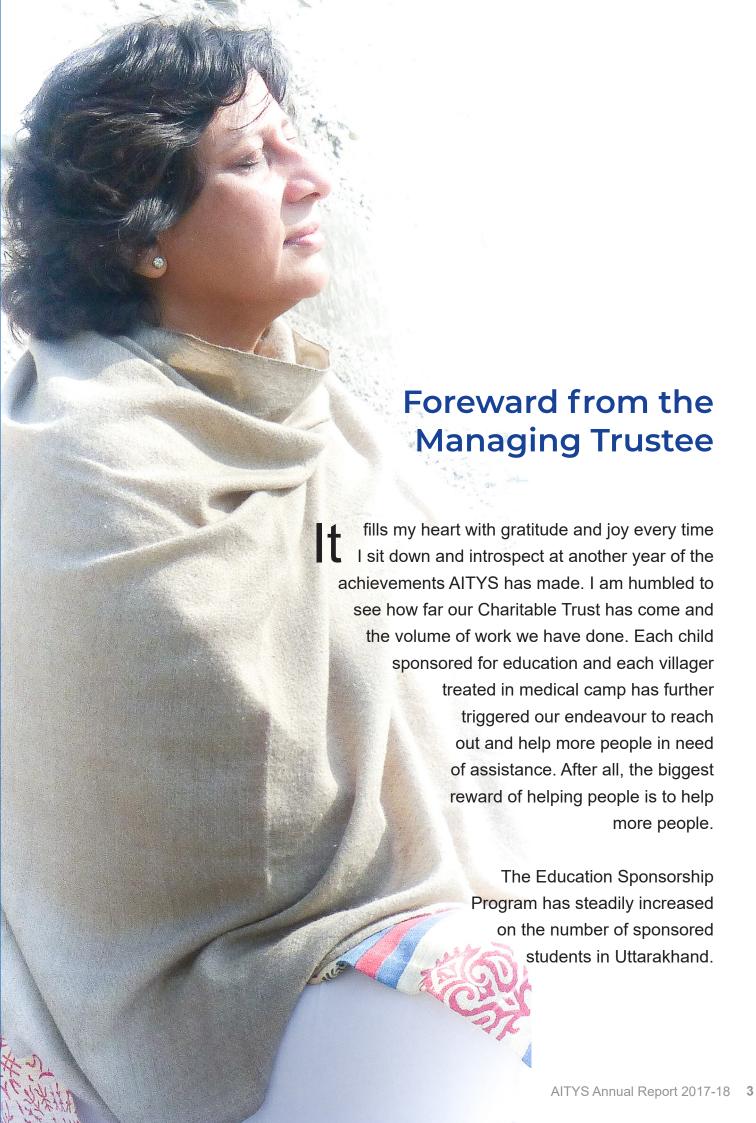

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This past year, AITYS witnessed a wonderful response from the schools' administration staff. Having seen us sponsor children and conduct medical camps year on year, many staff members open-up to us. During many visits, we were greeted by the felicitations of the assistance and care AITYS members have extended to the villagers and their children. This has indeed fuelled our desire to work harder and reach out to a larger number of needful people. From now on we will emphasis oncalling our Education Program - Education Project.

This past year we strived with comprehensive preparation and documentation work. AITYS has submitted the FCRA (Fair Credit Reporting Act) application with Government of India. Further to this major development we redesigned our Medical Camp structure. Additionally we launched a pilot project for the improvement of school-infrastructure and providing aid which directly benefits the students.

Our primary objective this year was FCRA approval. I am thankful to our volunteers, who along with the trustees spent a lot of time and energy to complete the documentation. The application was successfully filed in May 2017 and was received in September 2017.

As our initiatives increase, our numbers of volunteer increase as well. Their commitment to the cause is tremendous. Their unique skills and dedication to the initiative, makes things happen. Our documentation was honest and flawless due to which we received our FCRA Registration in a record time and in a single attempt.

We now increase our focus on the education and infrastructure initiatives, as these are far more important aspects as compared to medical camps. The key is to secure the future for people in the remote regions and therefore we aim at helping an increasing number of children complete secondary education.

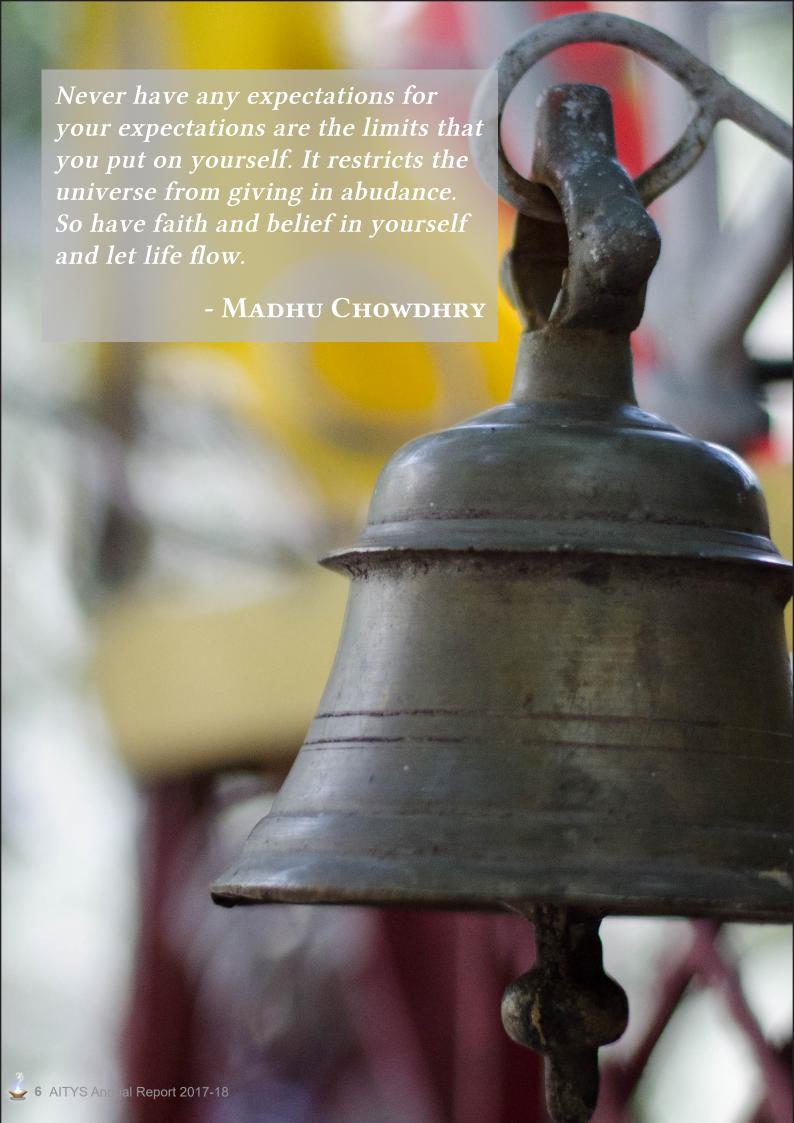
With the belief and encouragement from few of the government schools in Pauri Garhwal, most of our medical camps are now setup in their school compound. This has made our work easier to manage in comparison to the initial years when the camps were set up at road sides and bus stops.

To inspire hope and help the underprivileged living the rural State of Uttarakhand to achieve their true potential.

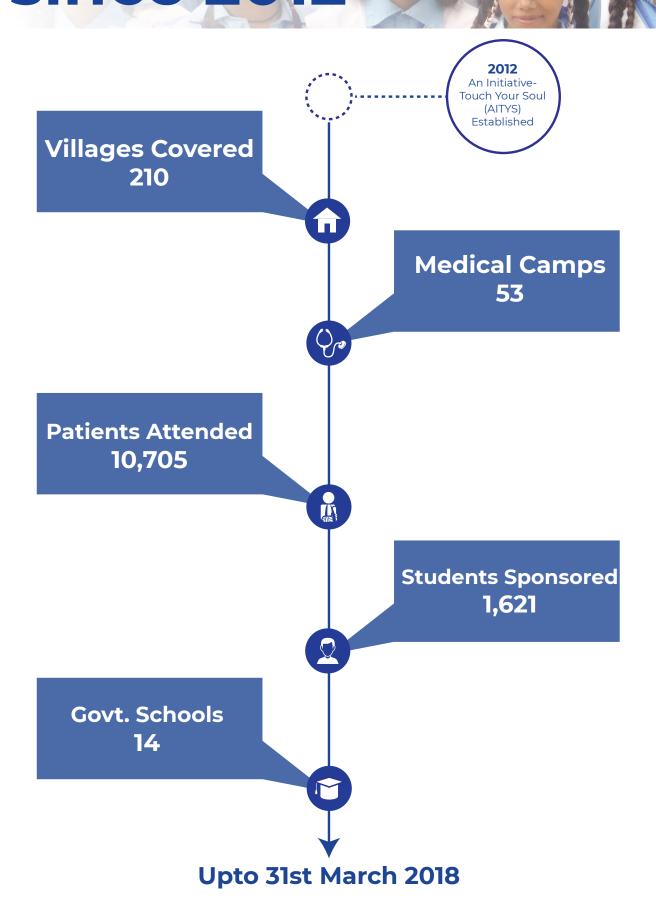


Area of Operation



Located partly in the Gangetic plain and partly in the northern Himalayas, Pauri Garhwal district encompasses an area of 5,230 square kilometers in the northern state of Uttarakhand, India. AITYS area of operation has its epicentre in the area between Devaprayag and Pauri.

Achievements since 2012







We are in our sixth year of medical camps which are being held in the remote regions of Pauri Garhwal. The medical camps have been of tremendous help to AITYS at understanding the ground level situation and conditions the families have been living in. We have seen multiple familiar faces who have benefited from these camps. They continue to interact with us and open up regarding their concerns.

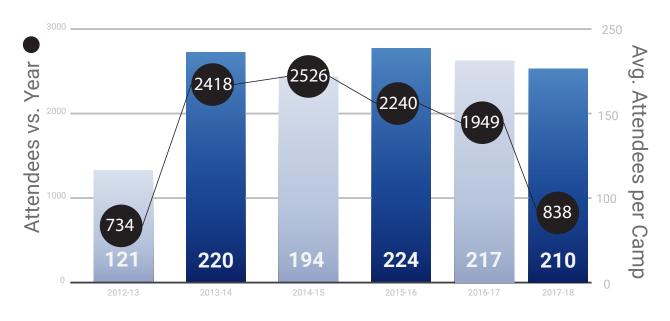
To make sure the medical camps happen properly, the government schools in Uttarakhand continue to help us by allowing to use their premises. It allows AITYS team to meet with not just the children, but also their families and many other villagers. While we have been showered with blessings for having extended the help, we are again reminded of the grave conditions these villagers have to face daily.

During 2017 - 2018, we held four medical camps spread across multiple days. Reduction in medical camps this past year has been primarily, as we ran a pilot for another project and our focus is shifting to other projects, in order for us to work towards, to provide an overall better growth to a child, in his life.

Highlights

- Consultation with Doctors and free distribution of non-prescription medicines
- Camp dates communicated well in advance by putting up posters/ banners in the area and informing village heads
- Conducting regular camps in rural schools for the benefit of students

Future Plans

- Continue to work towards holding regular camps at varied locations to serve a larger population on rotation basis
- Consult with villagers on the dates and location of each camp as per their requirements
- We are currently re-evaluating the impact and need for medical camps.



Our Education Sponsorship Program is steadily growing. It is now in its fifth year. Within the program, our focus remains on "Project Education" (a.k.a. EDU-02) as it helps ensure that children continue with their schooling after the Eighth Grade. It is a crucial moment as most of children are forced to drop-out during this academic year. This is primarily because the Government support for free education discontinues at this level and the financial burden falls on the families who do not have sustainable means of income. Just like the preceding academic years, our focus continues on increasing the number of students for senior high schools and colleges.

The following programs were running in 2016-17:

- 1. **EDU-01** For those affected by floods and other needy families
- 2. **EDU-02** For children in classes 9th 12th in Village Government High Schools whose families need financial help.
- 3. **EDU-03** For a selected few who need economic help for their college education, especially women doing B.Ed. etc.



Strict economic and academic criteria is applied, to ensure, that only those who are both deserving and needy are sponsored.

The ever-increasing documentation other administrative work is being managed by a team of dedicated volunteers, who multitask all the needs to the Trust. We are blessed that there is an ever increasing number of people who would like to volunteer their services. Almost all of these people are attendees of Mrs. Madhu Chowdhry's meditation/spirituality understand workshops and the importance of doing sewa. An increasing number of such volunteers are also helping spread the word about us and helping us raise additional funds for this noble cause.



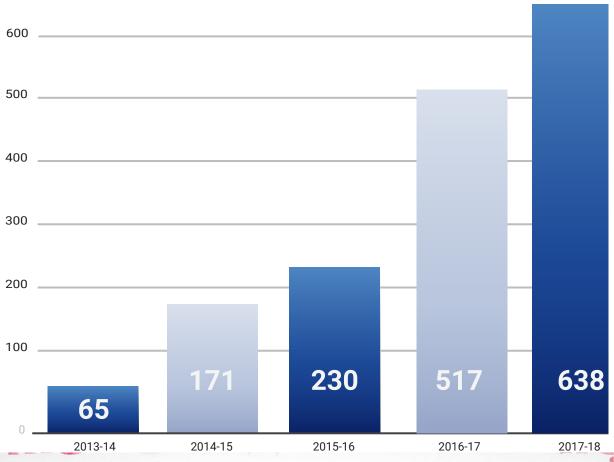

We are regularly presenting our work through social media, especially our facebook page which are then circulated by friends and family to increase awareness for our initiatives. Since inception, our friends and family have passionately helped us make things possible.

We see ourselves actively and continuously expanding the Education Sponsorship Program in scope and numbers, in the coming years. The trustees and volunteers are continuously making efforts to collect additional funds through donations to help accomplish our objectives.

Students Sponsored vs. Year







AITYS now experiences a new level of excitement with this new pilot project, we have started to aid schools and students with the basic infrastructure which propagates better learning.

During all these years having handed out funds for children's education we observed that by only helping children staying in school is insufficient for their personal growth. They were economically deprived - wearing tattered clothes, broken shoes and slippers. Almost all of them did not have woolens socks and sweaters to survive the extreme winters in the region. After intense discussions between board members and volunteers we decided to help students with the basic necessities. As always the first ones to help were friends and families which combined with the funds with AITYS ensured that this new initiative has a proper start. The initial response was heart-warming and made possible the provision of two sweaters, two pairs of shoes and three pairs of socks for children in three different schools (distributed during December 2017). We would never forget their happy faces on the day of the distribution. We saw that how much of a morale boost, it can do to a child's attitude. These beneficiary schools were in Dondal, Ghindwara and Kholachauri.



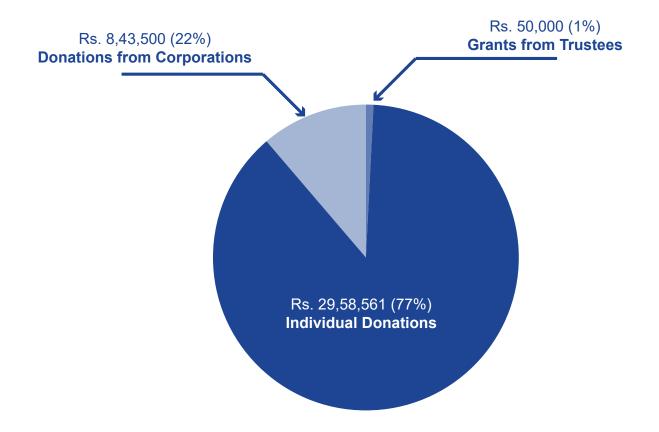


During the distribution in December 2017, one of the Sports teacher from Kholachauri approached and requested provision of track suits and sneakers for the children participating in an interschool sports meet. We did understand that this would give a tremendous boost to the participating children's confidence, as being poor they were wearing their old school uniforms. We are working on helping them with Sports Gear (TrackSuits, T-Shirts, Shorts, Socks, Sneakers) in the coming year. The intention now is to make the above an annual give-away however we are in the process of assessing and finalising it.

To ensure that the initiative works at root level, AITYS team has also decided to extend help with school infrastructure. We started with the repair of tables and chairs and are in the process of providing classroom learning aids (example projectors), so that, students can be made aware of things beyond their curriculum via study modules on the internet.

Tapping corporates and donor organizations to assist us with our initiatives - we have started to work on our presentation material – and we start to tap into corporates we know through the circle of our influence.

This last year was a good one for fund-raising and although we did not raise as much funds as the previous year, we did quite well. Individual donations were a significantly lower than the previous year, falling from Rs. 40 Lakhs to Rs. 29 Lakhs. However we understand that individual donations are best not considered in any trend as they can vary greatly every year. That being said, they continue to make the largest chunk of our donations and we remain very grateful to all individuals who contribute from their hard earned income.

We have been making efforts in tapping CSR funds and are happy to say that corporates have contributed over Rs. 8 Lakhs last year, a big jump from the Rs. 3 Lakhs the year before. We intend to continue making efforts in this direction as our FCRA registration helps us with this.

Now that we have the FCRA registration, we have begun making efforts to spread the word about our NGO abroad, so we can start getting donations into our FCRA account. We are planning to introduce ourselves in London through a small fundraiser in June this year. We hope this event and other such events will help us get regular donations from abroad in future.

We have been able to expand our corpus some more this year, which will give us some interest and more importantly act like a buffer reserve for the future. We hope to continue adding to our corpus every year, so that we are not deterred by dips in funding in any year.

We do not provide the names of our donors on social media or our website. This is because many of our donors choose to remain anonymous. Like us, most of our donors believe that it is the work that is important and "seva" is done best if no acknowledgement, credit or gratitude is expected for the same. It is also important to mention here that we believe that no donation is big or small and each individual, given their own constraints, gives what they can. All donations are accepted with immense gratitude. And may God bless all our donors and contributors.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES FORMING AN INTEGRAL PART OF ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED ON 31ST MARCH 2018

A. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- The accounts are prepared on historical cost basis as a 'Going Concern'. Donations are
 accounted for on receipt basis and payments are accounted for on accrual basis except
 otherwise stated, following generally accepted accounting principles and practices and
 Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India for NGOs,
 wherever applicable.
- Fixed Assets acquired / received in kind are directly charged to expenses accounts, however for the purpose of control, the same are recognized in the Balance Sheet through Contra entry.
- Fixed Assets are stated as under:
 - a) Assets directly acquired at purchase cost less accumulated depreciation.
 - b) Assets received in kind at stated / estimated cost less accumulated depreciation.
- 4. Depreciation on fixed assets is provided as per written down value method as per the rates prescribed in Income Tax Act, 1961, however, the same is not claimed as expense.

B. NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

- The medicines and other related items acquired are charged directly to the expenses since as per the organisation, the same are for free distribution and not to be sold hence has no value for them.
- 2. There are no payments made to trustees as remuneration or otherwise except travel, boarding and lodging expenses in attending the day to day affairs and medical camps etc.
- 3. There are no employees in the organisation hence the provision of Gratuity is not applicable to the organisation and accordingly no amount has been provided for the leave encashment.
- A sum of Rs.5,00,000 & Rs.2,50,000 has been accumulated towards "EDUCATION SUPPORT FUND" & "MEDICAL CAMP FUND" respectively under section 11(2) of the Income Tax Act 1961.
- The accounts for foreign contributions has been drawn on receipts and payment basis, however, as per the requirements of FCRA, an Income and Expenditure account has also been drawn and attached with the account.
- There is no contingent liability as on 31st March, 2018.
- 7. Previous year figures have been regrouped/ reclassified, wherever necessary
