



The focus has remained on helping the underprivileged villagers in the remote regions of Uttarakhand where basic medical assistance is scarcely available. We continue to check on the basic concerns the villagers face in this region. Villagers still seek assistance for basic medical assistance and while they may be glad to see us visit them, they always lookout for more help. And that is why AITYS is working hard at collecting funds for increasing the number of medical camps and medical supplies.

With each passing day, we pray to the Universe for its abundance and guidance to make our endeavors turn into reality. To make sure the medical camps happen properly, the government schools in Uttarakhand continue to help us by allowing to use their premises. It allows AITYS team to meet with not just the children, but also their families and many other villagers. While we have been showered with blessings for having extended the help, we are again reminded of the grave conditions these villagers have to face daily.

During 2016 - 2017, we held 9 medical camps spread across multiple days. Reduction in medical camps this past year has been primarily to arrange for funds.





AITYS has completed another well deserved year for its Education Sponsorship Program which completes the total to four years. I am humbled to recollect the first instance where only a handful of cheques were distributed. As our initiative for sponsoring children grows bigger, more villagers are now approaching us for assistance.

While they may have surfaced out from the damage of the 2013 floods in Uttarakhand, the limited and seasonal means of income continue to hinder the children's higher education in the region. It is still a common scene to see a helpless child stand with his family requesting for monetary assistance. The concern remains that this scenario will not change for a long time to come. Therefore AITYS does realize how important it is to continue working on the Education Sponsorship Program.

The following programs were running in 2016-17 :

1. **EDU-01** – For those affected by floods and other needy families

2. **EDU-02 (Project 6400)** – For children in classes 9th - 12th in Village Government High Schools whose families need financial help.

3. **EDU-03** – For a selected few who need economic help for their college education, vocational training, women doing B.Ed. etc.

We continue to apply the strict economic and academic criteria, to ensure, that only those who are both deserving and needy are sponsored.

As our experience grows at this managing program, we observe that the time spent on the administrative activities by our team of volunteers has increased sufficiently. Documentation is of utmost importance to ensure every penny donated is managed properly and efficiently.

We see ourselves actively and continuously expanding the Education Sponsorship Program in scope and numbers, in the coming years. The trustees and volunteers are continuously making efforts to collect additional funds through donations to help accomplish our objectives.





# Volunteers & Donors

Last year was a challenging one for fund-raising. Donations were about one-third lower than the previous year. Grants by funding agencies stopped completely on account of their own compulsions. We had already been reaching out to extended family and friends in the last couple of years, this source of funding also started slackening. Our efforts in tapping CSR funds has yet not borne fruit as most corporations seemed to be focusing on government initiatives or prefer to bring about change in the vicinity of their own factories and not in a remote, unrelated, area of Uttarakhand.

This paucity of funds for our initiatives made us dig into our meagre corpus so that running projects would not suffer and continuity would be ensured. Importantly, it has also made us rethink, our entire approach towards fund-raising. We now understand what corporations and trusts are looking for and hence we need to take a different approach, if we want to tap them for funds. We hope that our efforts in this direction will show results in the next year's funding efforts.

We currently do not provide the exact figure donated by any donor as we believe that no donation is big or small and each individual, given their own constraints, gives what they can. All donations are accepted with immense gratitude.

#### **INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT**

TO THE MEMBERS OF AN INITIATIVE – TOUCH YOUR SOUL New Delhi

#### SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES FORMING AN INTEGRAL PART OF ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED ON 31<sup>ST</sup> MARCH 2017

#### A. <u>SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES</u>

- 1. The accounts are prepared on historical cost basis as a 'Going Concern'. Donations are accounted for on receipt basis and payments are accounted for on accrual basis except otherwise stated, following generally accepted accounting principles and practices and Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India for NGOs, wherever applicable.
- 2. Fixed Assets acquired / received in kind are directly charged to expenses accounts.
- 3. Fixed Assets are stated as under:
  - a) Assets directly acquired at purchase cost less accumulated depreciation.
  - b) Assets received in kind at stated / estimated cost less accumulated depreciation.
- 4. Depreciation on fixed assets is provided as per written down value method as per the rates prescribed in Income Tax Act, 1961.

#### B. <u>NOTES TO ACCOUNTS</u>

- 1. The medicines and other related items acquired are charged directly to the expenses since as per the organisation, the same are for free distribution and not to be sold hence has no value for them.
- 2. There are no payments made to trustees as remuneration or otherwise except travel, boarding and lodging expenses in attending the day to day affairs and medical camps etc.
- 3. There are no employees in the organisation hence the provision of Gratuity is not applicable to the organisation and accordingly no amount has been provided for the leave encashment.
- 4. Rs.1,39,372/- has been accumulated in the financial year 2015-16 under clause (2) of the Explanation to section 11(1) of the Income Tax Act,1961, has been utilized in the year 2016-17.
- A sum of Rs. 15,00,000 & Rs.5,00,000 has been accumulated towards "EDUCATION SUPPORT FUND" & "MEDICAL CAMP FUND" respectively under section 11(2) of the Income Tax Act 1961.
- 6. There is no contingent liability as on  $31^{st}$  March, 2017.
